An article for the *Agenda*? It's been awhile since I wrote one, what to write, what to write... Nuthin happenin' in the Stone household. Oh, we did jet off to the UK for a few weeks in July, I have had parliamentarian contracts, but otherwise take care of the grand-kids, and the parental units- yep, the sandwich generation is alive and well.

Oh yeah, need to focus - this is a parlie publication- so what's new in the world of meetings that could possibly be noteworthy enough for an article? Well, there is a little trip that Alice, Peggy, Jeff, Bev and I did take to the NAP Convention in St. Petersburg, Florida. Fun - yep, nice place, sure, but was the convention out of the ordinary, noteworthy, exciting? YOU BET!! Why?? Because of **all the Rs**!

The first "R" - Revision of the NAP Bylaws. Personally as a delegate and microphone monitor, I witnessed every possible form of appeal, debate, voting, maneuvering, delaying tactic, motion - even a motion at the end of the amendment process to postpone the  $\underline{\mathbf{R}}$  evision indefinitely. For me to observe and participate in this process was truly one of the best learning opportunities I have ever experienced. Way back I kidded my mentor, Peggy Long, about how boring it must be to attend a meeting of parliamentarians, and with a twinkle in her eye, she smiled and said, "Just you wait..." Ultimately the Revision was passed by the delegation and the NAP Board met immediately in the front of the meeting hall and voted to accept the Revision (that's a whole other article...) The second (and 3rd and 4th...) "R"? - Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised In Brief, the second edition was available for the first time! Woo Hoo! All you need to know in less than 200 pages (well... 197 to be exact) to run a simple meeting. An introduction and guide to be sure, but why now? because of... the fifth (and 6th and 7th...) "R" -Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised, 11th Edition had its coming out party at the same time! Finally, we could all hold it in our hands-not just hold it, but Read it - the first meeting of the NAP delegates was held under the 10th edition, and the very next day, the 11th edition Ruled! There are important changes in the 11th edition - how to ask for information, changes to the disciplinary procedures, revision in how a small board and committee may be less formal, electronic meetings addressed more thoroughly - 17 significant changes, and another 103 (103!) less significant changes!
